

HMDCB Certification

Difference from ABMS or AOA subspecialty certification in hospice and palliative medicine:

HMDCB certification is complementary to ABMS and AOA certification, but specific to the practice of **hospice medicine**. It assesses additional expertise in the unique competencies to perform the role of a Hospice Medical Director (HMD), such as regulatory, administrative, legal, ethical, and clinical skills appropriate for hospice patients.

Hospice Medical Directors and other hospice physicians come from a wide range of professional backgrounds. Many have followed varied career paths before joining hospice programs, which means not all are able—or choose—to pursue full hospice and palliative medicine subspecialty board certification through ABMS or AOA. However, these physicians often seek a formal recognition process that validates their commitment to hospice medicine and supports their work in the field. HMDCB certification provides that focused pathway, offering a solid foundation for these physicians to become certified.

Because HMDCB certification is distinct from ABMS and AOA subspecialty certifications, it can serve to **enhance the work of hospice and palliative medicine specialists** who choose to become HMDs or hospice physicians.

HMDCB Certification:

- Validates knowledge and skills of hospice physicians/HMDs
- Helps address the growing workforce and quality issues in the field
- Enhances the work of the palliative care specialist
- Offers eligibility through an experiential "practice" pathway not currently offered through the ABMS or the AOA

Even though I was hospice and palliative medicine fellowship trained and board certified, as a hospice executive and physician being certified as hospice medical director early on was a no brainer. This certification offered me the skill set and the tools to help sharpen my skills and enhance my knowledge in hospice medicine with special recognition of quality and consistency of the practice within hospice.
